Maloney moved and Paul seconded the adoption of the resolution. Roll Call - Ayes - Collins, Crosby, Hunt, Maloney, Paul, Ralf, and Swanson. Absent - Gummert. Resolution adopted.

Swanson moved and Collins seconded that the bills as audited and submitted be approved for payment and that the City Clerk be authorized to issue warrants in payment of same. Roll Call - Ayes - Collins, Crosby, Hunt, Maloney, Paul, Ralf and Swanson. Absent - Gummert. Motion carried.

Alvin Grey reported 53 farm inspections and 38 milk analyses.

Albert Loecke reported that 66 electrical permits were issued in November and 21 building permits; 12 were for new homes. The value of the building permits being \$183,600.00.

Chester Hodgdon, representing the Hodgdon Bus Service, appeared before the Council explaining some of his problems. Discussion followed. Further consideration to be given at a later meeting.

Dr. Samuels appeared before the Council regarding the March of Dimes. He requested permission to hang plastic containers on 3 blocks of parking meters from 2nd Avenue to First Street on Main Street for two continuous weeks in January. Ralf moved and Paul seconded that permission be granted. Motion carried.

Swanson advised that the list of unpaid sewage bills had been submitted, totaling \$840.16. Swanson moved and Crosby seconded that any sewage bills still unpaid after December 15th be certified to the County Auditor for collection. Roll Call - Ayes - Collins, Crosby, Hunt, Maloney, Paul, Ralf and Swanson. Absent - Gummert. Motion carried.

Swanson referred to the "bull-clam equipment" at the Land Fill which is in need of repair or replacement. Discussion followed. Swanson moved and Maloney seconded that the present tractor used and now operating at the land fill be repaired as previously outlined, cost not to exceed \$5100.00; including Herman Brown Company furnishing the city with the loan of a machine and transportation until such time as our own equipment is again ready for use. Councilmen referred to the coming meeting on December 26th, which is being celebrated as a holiday this year, and requested adjournment until December 27th.
